Arthur Walker Bingham III

Walker, as he was known, died a year ago April, but the club did not receive news from his wife Nicolette until this year. Bingham was at one time President of the Church Club of New York, a Vestryman of St. James Church and a longtime member of the Laymen's Club. A funeral service was held last year at the Church of the Epiphany.

Austin Flint

Austin and his wife Aili faithfully attended the 11 AM service at the Cathedral for many years. Sadly, he passed away on February 1st, 2015. He was a member of both the Congregation of Saint Saviour and the Board of Regents. Austin was a playwright and a Professor of Creative Writing at Columbia University School of the Arts. He generously gave a benefit at the Cathedral where he performed a monologue of his play "The Flaming Spider: Jonathan Edwards in Northampton". He is survived by his wife Aili, his son Petri, his daughter Christina and 5 grandchildren.



Allison Pritchett

Allison was the wife of our former Dean, Harry Pritchett. She died this August in Birmingham, AL near family and not far from where she grew up in Tuscaloosa. Described by some as a 'shining light of goodness', Allison touched many lives with her grace and humor and faith.

John "Tinker" Bell

John was the brother of longtime club member JoAnn Bell, died an untimely death in his 67th year on September 5, 2016. He was a devoted father to Alex and Julian. He made a name for himself in Toronto directing SCTV and numerous other Canadian series over his career. Although he struggled with depression he was generous soul, loving to all and a very funny man!




Joseph Walsh



Joe was the partner of former Cathedral employee, Don Lundquist. He was also a longtime member of St. John's Church, Getty Square, in Yonkers. Dr Walsh was a leading retinal specialist and was committed to humanitarian work, especially in his efforts to provide quality ophthalmic care to underserved populations in the Holy Land. He was also most generous in helping with the request for donations for the railings to the great choir. A service was held here at The Cathedral Church just 2 weeks ago.

Philip Roskam

Philip was the husband of Bishop Catherine Roskam, past Suffragan Bishop of New York. Dr. Roskam was a Clinical Psychologist in private practice. The Diocese of LA described Phil as a gentle, compassionate and intuitive person with a great sense of humor and a huge heart. His talent as a therapist helped many people change their lives for the better. A memorial service was held in March here at The Cathedral.



Catherine Scott



Catherine was the wife of former Laymen's Club President Chris Scott. She had been fighting cancer for a long time and passed into glory while in Florida, where the Scotts have a winter home. Catherine was a long time active lay leader at the Cathedral, holding various posts including Head of the Altar Guild and Corp. Secretary of the Cathedral's Congregation. Catherine was also one of our Lectors and loved to read. She was even one of the inspirations behind 2nd Sundays. Her joy, kindness and enthusiasm will be sorely missed.

Camille Ryan

Camille was a past member of The Laymen's Club as well as a member of the Congregation of St. Saviour. She was the first EFM mentor at the cathedral and she was a lay Eucharistic minister. A retired English teacher she was known for her quick sense of humor and great kindness.

Charles D. MacLachlan

Charles was a graduate of the Cathedral School class of '74. He was a member of the Choristers. He had a successful career in advertising and was active in a number of charities.



Paul Brenner

Paul was an active member of the Congregation of St. Saviour in the 80's and 90's, serving as Verger and Vestry member. Paul later moved to San Francisco where he became a Pastor and Hospice innovator, helping to transform thousands of people's lives and he is remembered by many with a great deal of love.
